Notes for Lesson 7

1 Welcome



Bring several mirrors to class for students to look at themselves when answering questions.



Pass around a play microphone and invite students to share one thing about themselves that makes them special.



Using “God Makes People Special” *In Class 7* paper, let the students interview each other.



Use *Teacher Guide* activity option in the sidebar on page 55.

2 Bible Time



Use a blank sheet of paper to cover sections of the *In Class 7* paper you are not working on.

When completing “What Else Does Jesus Say?” *In Class 7* paper, ask students to show a thumbs up or down to indicate if the answer is true or false.



When completing activities in the *In Class* paper, read out loud together as a class.

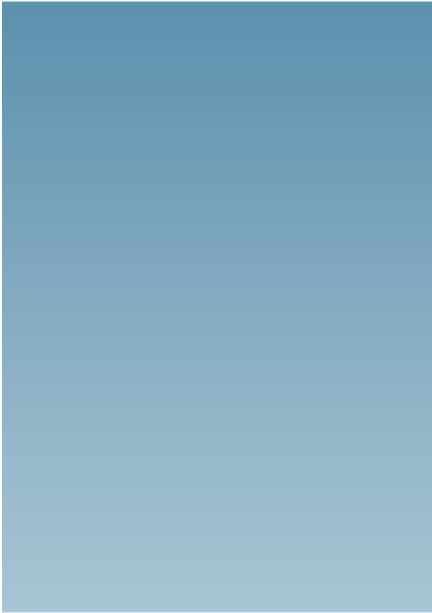

3 Explore and Apply



Write three steps of forgiveness (*Teacher Guide*, page 57, last paragraph) on the board as you teach.

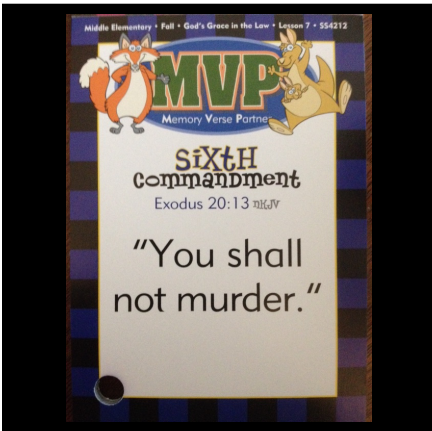

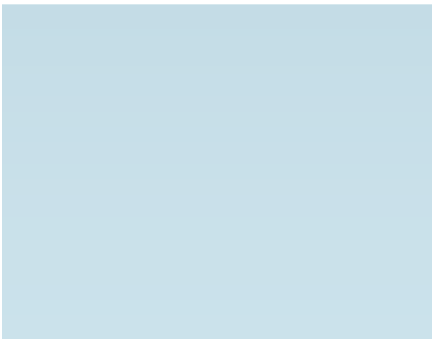

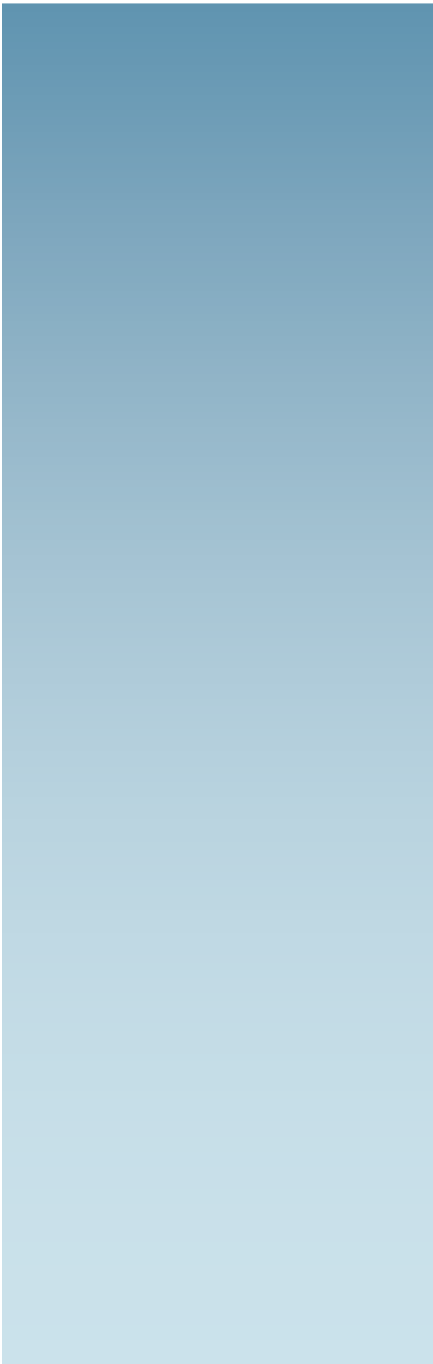
When playing Burning Ball, recite Exodus 20:13, “*You shall not murder.*”
