# Notes for Lesson 8 ? Welcome



Show students real wedding rings or a picture of real wedding rings.




Ask students why they think married people wear wedding rings.

Show pictures of a bride and groom (or dolls dressed up). Explain that God made marriage to be between one man and one woman for as long as they live.



### Bible Time



Write on the board: Marriage = 1 man + 1 woman



When reading out loud, pause and give students time to process what they have heard before answering questions and completing the activities.



In advance, cut out three large hearts with the words to match "Being Pure in Heart, Language and Conduct" *In Class 8* paper. In class, write the words HEART, LANGUAGE, CONDUCT on the board. Ask students to match the hearts with the words on the board and give examples.

Before singing, lead students in saying the 7th commandment.




Tell students to stand when they hear the 7th commandment in the song.
